At least 3 months before your projected move:

- 2. Determine your budget.** You want to be realistic about your home sale—most sellers obviously have an emotional attachment to their home. - 3. 6. Stay on top of the contract and closing process. Your **Mil PCS, Inc.** network agent will obviously help in this process! After or near your closing date:

7. Review the HUD-1 statement. If the closing and/or title company are doing their jobs, you should be provided the HUD-1 at least 24 hours before closing, and 2 days are preferable. This is your last chance to verify that all transactions are correct and that the buyers and sellers fees are what was agreed upon. You absolutely need to discuss the HUD-1 with your Mil PCS, Inc. agent—this is what they get paid to do!

8. Begin notifying all applicable agencies. Insurance companies, creditors, US Postal Service, friends and family, etc. all we need to be notified of your new address. Missing a credit card or car payment while you're in transition can be a big hassle.

9. Save all your documents. Tax codes are constantly changing, but many of your closing costs and relocation expenses can be tax deductible. A move during tax season (Spring) can be extremely challenging—if you have all of your documents saved and organized, it will eliminate a huge hassle!
